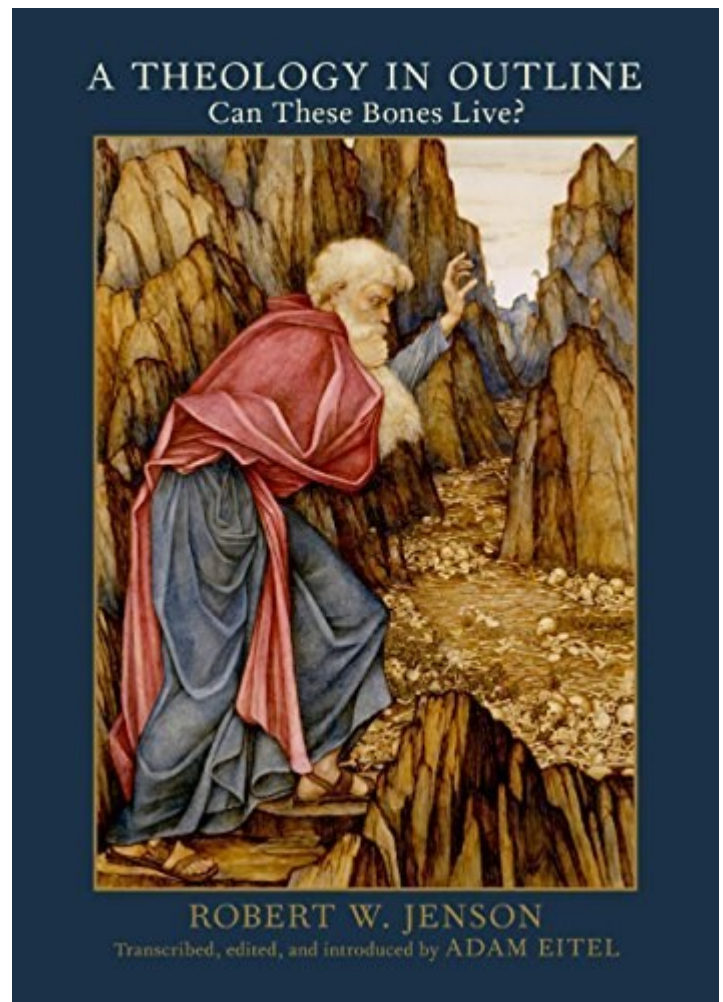


Reading Theology Together

This course is an invitation to learn how to read theology books. While by no means an easy task we think we have found a way forward. We have chosen a very short but precise book by a superb theologian. The book would work well as an introduction to a University course but we think it is equally suited to a general audience, curious about faith. So we offer an online course on this book to be held in November this year (2024).

The course will be led by the Dean of Windsor, Bishop Christopher Cocksworth and the Revd Canon Dr Hueston Finlay.



Aim: To give you confidence to read theological books.

Our Expectation: To make the most of this opportunity it is important that you have read the Chapters as outlined below before we meet up online.

05: Chapters 1 & 2: What is Theology? *and* Israel (Hueston)

12: Chapters 3 & 4: Jesus and Resurrection *and* The Triune God (Christopher)

19: Chapters 5, 6 & 7: Creation *and* The Image of God *and* Sin and Salvation (Hueston)

26: Chapters 8 & 9: Church *and* Can These Bones Live? (Christopher)
